

How CodeSignal manages proctoring & ID verification



Candidate takes proctored evaluation

Prior to starting an assessment or interview, the candidate is prompted to share the following:

- Camera & microphone
- Screen
- Valid, government-issued photo ID

During the evaluation, CodeSignal records the candidate's video, audio, and computer screen.



CodeSignal reviews the recording

After the candidate completes the evaluation, CodeSignal's team of proctoring specialists reviews the recording for rule violations.

If no rule violations or anomalies are detected, CodeSignal verifies the result—typically within 1-3 business days of the candidate completing the evaluation.



CodeSignal notifies company of decision

The hiring company is notified of the proctoring decision and will receive explanation for any rejected submissions.

If you were using proctoring for an assessment and the candidate result was not verified, they can retake the assessment after a cooldown period (varies by assessment).

About ID Verification

Show or upload a photo of a valid, government-issued photo ID

(such as a driver's license, state ID, or passport)

CodeSignal proctors verify

- name of the candidate taking the evaluation
- image of the candidate on the screen
- expiration date
- Cross-check all global IDs (ex: passports) against local images to ensure authenticity

If a candidate does not have a government issued photo ID, we ask the candidate to reach out to our support team to request a special accommodation. The support team will work with the candidate to confirm their identification via valid documentation that includes photo and name.

If a candidate is unprepared or unable to show their photo ID during the proctored evaluation, CodeSignal has a standard process for managing post-completion ID verifications. This prevents the immediate rejection of candidates that mistakenly forgot to bring an ID.
